
### **Rules & Regulations**

Aim of	The competition aims to promote the production of quality		
competition	Connemara Performance ponies by evaluating and recognising up and		
	coming talent.		
Eligibility	The class is open to registered Connemara ponies, stallion, mare or		
	gelding between 5 and 9 years old on the day of the show to be ridden		
	by riders any age. A special rosette will be awarded to the highest		
	placed rider 18 years or under. Previous winners and ponies that have		
	won a Connemara Performance class at a championship show i.e.		
	Balmoral, Dublin Horse Show and Clifden are NOT eligible		
Stallions	Stallions must be ridden by riders who have attained their 14 <sup>th</sup>		
	birthday on 1 <sup>st</sup> January in the year of the show.		
<b>Passports</b>	Passports must be available for inspection on the day of the		
	competition.		

	The Sarah Miller Future Performance Competition Format		
Class	The competition will begin with 'flat work' . The flat work phase will be		
format	followed by the jumping round which must conclude with a halt and salute. Competitors will also be required to strip their ponies and present them in hand individually in the separate conformation phase. The three phases will be run concurrently.

Flat work (phase 1)	Ridden Flat Work Phase Each competitor will halt and salute the Judge and wait for the start signal before commencing.	Marks 70



Marker	Movement	Requirement
X	Halt	Straight, square, immobile on the bit – maintain for 3 seconds
from X	Medium Walk. 20m Circle Left	4-time rhythm with correct bend, showing a degree of overtracking
from X	Working Trot. 20m Circle right	2-time rhythm with correct bend, showing active hind leg engagement
at X	Working Canter. 20m Circle Left	Smooth transition and correct strike off on left lead. 3-time rhythm with correct bend and balance
through X	2-3 Trot Strides. Canter ½ 20m Circle Right	Smooth transition and correct strike off on right leg, 3-time rhythm with correct bend and balance
2nd ½ 20m Circle	Progressive downward transitions through trot & walk	Well defined trot & walk, maintaining contact & balance
at X	Halt	Straight, square, immobile – for 3 seconds
Proceed	(by progressive transitions in working canter directly to the first fence)

Note: as competitors proceed directly to the jumping phase, the same tack and clothing must be worn for the flatwork phase as for the jumping phase.

Jumping	• spurs are NOT allowed.

	• running martingales, overreach boots and/ or tendon boots are		
	allowed.		
	• bandages are not allowed.		
	• double bridles are not allowed.		
	• whips must not exceed 75cm in length.		
	• It is obligatory for all competitors to wear a skull cap or riding hat		
	equal to or greater than the appropriate current British Safety		
	Standard. <b>N.B</b> A competitor whose hat comes off, or chinstrap		
	undone whilst competing, must on Penalty of Elimination replace it		
	and/or fasten it before continuing.		
	• Body Protectors are strongly recommended for Jumping.		

#### N.B.

- Riders should present themselves to the gate steward.
- When admitted to the ring, riders should ride up to the judge's marker/ writer to announce their number.
- Riders must await permission from the judge to start the flatwork/jumping phase.
- Please note that there may be a number of fences in a cross-country style and the course may include a water tray and bank.
- The **finalised** course will be announced open for <u>inspection on foot</u> on the day of the show by the organisers.
- It is the competitor's responsibility to inspect the **finalised** course and make sure he/she understands the correct course before competing.
- If a rider is eliminated at any phase he/she or any other substitute rider may not continue with the next phase.

**N.B.** in the event of a tie, the pony with the highest jumping mark will be the winner. If there is still a tie, the pony with the highest flatwork mark will be the winner.

Objections	Any objections or complaints against the judge, the organisers or another competitor must be lodged in writing with the Show Secretary within <u>one hour</u> following completion of the competition together with €/Stg.100.00, which is refundable in the event of the objection being upheld.
